The land at Brindyhill comprises primarily of three IACS-registered field parcels together with an additional small parcel making up the total area for sale of 3.5 hectares (8.6 acres) or thereby. The land provides good livestock grazing, as well as being utilised for hay making in recent years, and is classified as Grade 3(2) by the James Hutton Institute. The agricultural land is fully fenced and supplied by water, with the land also benefitting from two ponds. The land has direct roadside access off the Bg92, being conveniently situated between the settlements of Auchleven and Keig, with onward road links to Insch and Alford.

There is a disused former telephone exchange and the footprint of a former dwellinghouse 'Brindyhill' situated within the subjects. No planning consent has been investigated by the current owners and interested parties should make their own enquiries in this regard.

Additional land to the east of the B992 may be available for sale by separate negotiation.

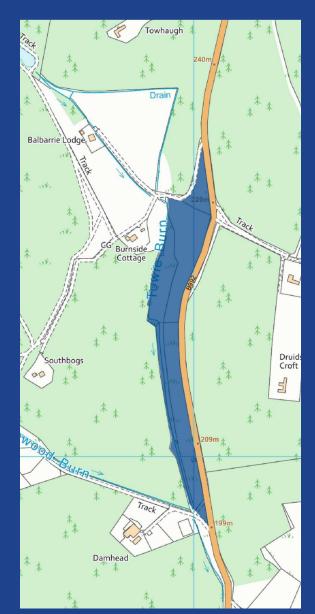
